Internships 4940 Policies:

- Students must be in good academic standing (a term <u>and</u> cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher) and cannot be on academic probation to apply for approval of an Internship.
- Students must not have any active Student Conducts holds to apply for approval of an Internship.
- Students may not complete an Internship at an existing position.
- Students must work 50 hours for each credit hour earned. 3-credit and 6-credit options are available.
- Students must fulfill all the assignments outlined in the syllabus, and the Internship supervisor must submit a performance evaluation
- Internships receive a grade of S or U (pass/fail).
- Students may not earn retroactive credit for Internships.
- A maximum of 6 hours of Internship may apply to graduation for General Studies and Interdisciplinary Studies majors.
- A maximum of 12 hours of Internship, Readings, and/or Special Problems may apply to graduation for General Studies and Interdisciplinary Studies majors.
- The Office Reserves the right to deny internship project approval to any student or any internship site it believes will not reflect positively on the University.
- **NOTE**: Students planning to complete an Internship abroad must complete the steps outlined at https://omd.missouri.edu/?q=internships BEFORE submitting an internship application.

Internship Proposal Instructions: Compose a well-written proposal outlining the details of your internship. Papers should have 1-inch formatting, 12 point Times New Roman font, page numbers, and double-spacing. Address the following specifics in your proposal and attach the document to your internship application. (Length: 250-600 words)

- Who: Name the company or organization for which you are interning and explain what it does. Include your supervisor's name and position.
- What: Explain the specific tasks you will perform, the responsibilities you will hold, and the assignments you expect to complete during the internship period.
- Where: State the specific location where you will be interning.
- When: Report the days, times and duration (date range) during which you will be interning. Remember that you must work 50 hours for each credit earned. 3 credits = 150 hours; 6 credits = 300 hours.
- Why: Explain why you think this will be a worthwhile experience. How will you benefit from this experience? How will the company or organization benefit from your work?
- How: How will this internship specifically connect to one or more of the components in your individualized major?

The Office of Multidisciplinary Degrees reserves the right to ask you to resubmit your proposal and/or application if it is incomplete and/or if there are significant errors with format/organization/mechanics. Your writing reflects your academic and professional ability, and you should take it seriously. You are expected to proofread your proposal in advance to check for any errors.

Readings 4960 Description: Students work independently with MU faculty on research and/or professional projects. A student finds a campus professor with whom to work. Together, they create concrete objectives for a meaningful project. The professor guides and supervises the student towards completion of the project and is responsible for awarding a letter grade for the course. A maximum of 12 hours of Internship, Readings, and/or Special Problems may apply to graduation for General Studies and Interdisciplinary Studies majors.

Internship or Readings as Capstone:

- The Capstone must be completed in the final 45 hours of coursework.
- Students must earn a C- or higher or grade of Satisfactory to fulfill the Capstone requirement.
- Students must have a Capstone approved by their academic advisor.
- Students may complete an Internship or Readings without using the hours to fulfill the Capstone requirement.
